

## PROOF OF VACCINATION STARTING SEPTEMBER 22, 2021

As part of Ontario's Roadmap to Re-open, the government announced that facilities such as ours will require all patrons to be fully vaccinated (with limited exceptions) starting Wednesday, September 22, 2021. Mario's Bowl will be asking all patrons upon entry for proof of their 2<sup>nd</sup> dose of an authorized Covid-19 vaccine. This proof must include your name, date of final vaccination (must be at least 14 days prior to current date) and type of vaccine you received. You will also need to provide government issued identification showing your name and date of birth to match the proof of vaccine given.

As per the amended regulation, "A business or an organization shall not retain any information provided pursuant to this section." This means Mario's Bowl will not and can not record your vaccination status and proof of vaccination can be asked upon entry each and every visit (including those leaving and re-entering).

Line ups may occur while we are checking for proof and we ask that all patrons have patience with our staff while we navigate this new addition to the already changing rules that we have been enduring. These rules will apply until the provincial government or local health authority remove or add restrictions. *Any aggressive behaviour towards our staff will not be tolerated at any time and the patron will be required to leave the premises.* Staff at all businesses impacted by this are just doing their job and the business is doing what is required to keep their doors open. We also ask that you keep 2 metres distance between you/your group and any groups you may not be with.
